Dear Mr. Flyth:

The purpose of this letter is to report to you the findings of the Membership Selection Committee with regard to the suspension of Anthony Mione. Mr. Mione was suspended because a letter was sent to the national office alleging that he had been arrested and convicted on a charge of soliciting for prostitution. A committee of volunteers met to review this matter because that was the procedure at the time of Mr. Mione's suspension.

Our findings are as follows:

1. The allegation appears to be true. Mr. Mione was arrested by an undercover policewoman and charged with the summary offense of soliciting for prostitution. There is every indication that Mr. Mione's offense in this case was verbal rather than physical. The policewoman was known to Mr. Mione, as was her boyfriend. It was after a discussion concerning the boyfriend that he was arrested. It is our view that this was an isolated incident and simply one in which Mr. Mione was speaking in a situation where a more prudent course of action would have been no conversation at all.
2. This one incident does not represent Mr. Mione's character. Nor should one moment of this nature be allowed to define anyone's character. It is a life-time of acts and actions that paint the total picture. He has been a fine Scout leader and has run a creditable Scouting Program since he took over as Scoutmaster of Troop 115 in Tower City, PA. He is a member of St. Paul's RC Church and is a past President of the Holy Name Society. His interest in Scouting has extended beyond his own unit to other units in the district where his interest in reptiles has been a welcome program addition.
3. Tower City is a very small town. Mr. Mione's legal involvement was well known to everyone in town for a long time prior to the time he was asked to be Scoutmaster. Not only had Mr. Mione been up-front with everyone about this, but it had been in the Harrisburg papers which are widely read in Tower City.


4. There is a disquieting element of vendetta in this case. Mr. Mione agreed to become Scoutmaster of Troop 115 after the previous Scoutmaster, Wayne Reiner, was asked to resign and whose Scouting membership was subsequently suspended. It is not unreasonable for us to suspect that the motive for the letter sent to the national office was one of vengeance and not moral indignation, coming as it did only after Mr. Reiner's appeals of his suspension had been exhausted and "revealing" facts known to everyone in town for over two years. Whether or not this element has a bearing on the case in question, it still has chilling implications in this and similar cases because of the revenge motive involved.

Among the members of the committee, there was consensus that the written revelation to the National Office of this single act of verbal indiscretion, while stupid and inappropriate for a leader of boys, occurred prior to Mr. Mione's selection as a unit leader and as such was not sufficient cause for his permanent termination as an active Scouter. It is the recommendation of the committee that Mr. Mione be readmitted to Scouting in his former position.

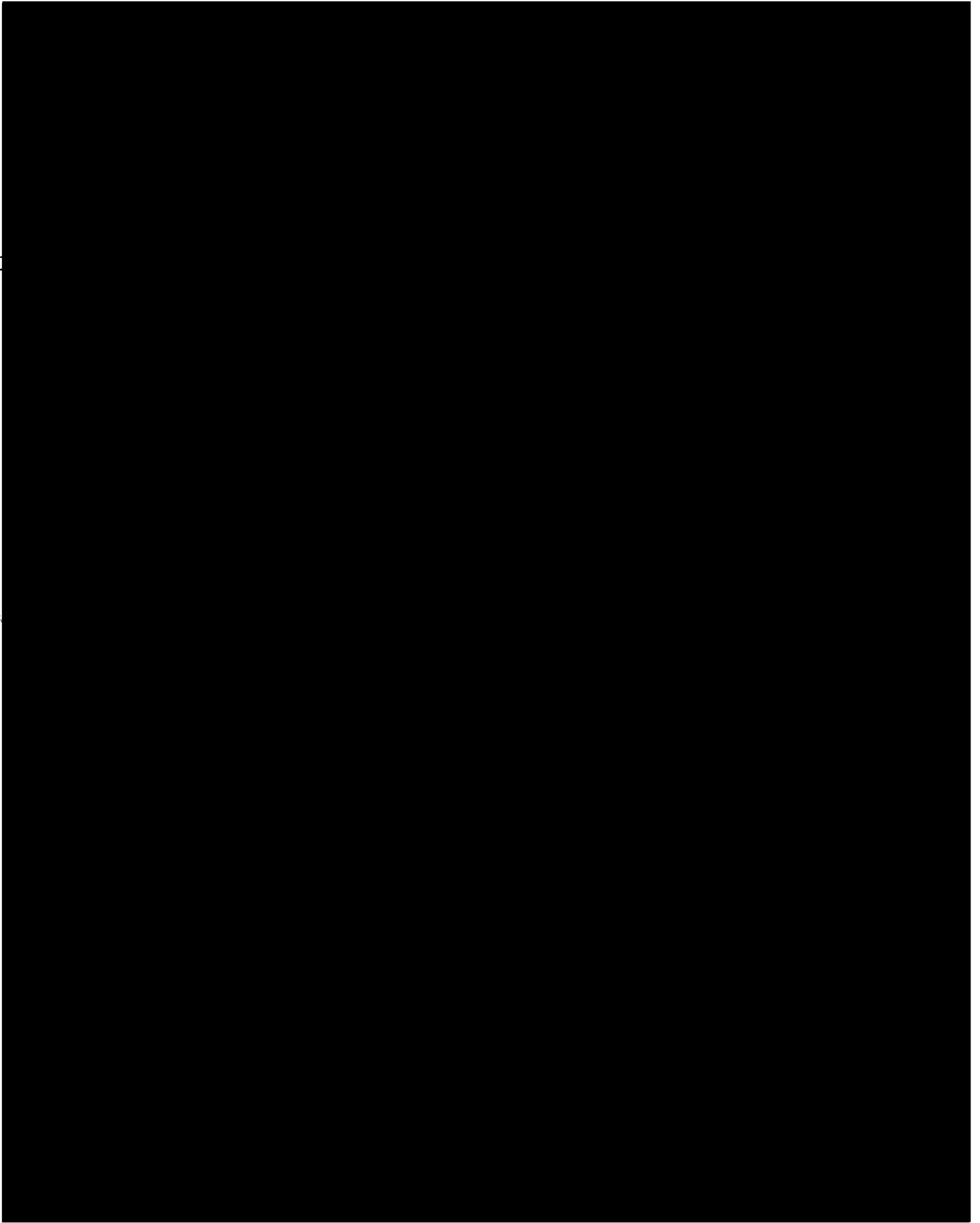

After all, if [redacted] and [redacted] can forgive their husbands, then why can't we?

This is not an issue of morals. Rather it is an issue of dirty tricks. No one from Pack 85 or Troop 115 is spreading rumors, digging through old police news, or generally bad-mouthing Wayne Reiner and his associates. And the reason for this is that Pack 85 and Troop 115 personnel is above this childish behavior. In the many conversations I have had with the Tower City unit personnel, none of the people except Reiner and his associates want this bad situation to continue. They would prefer to get on with the business at hand, which is to provide the Scouting program to their youth.

Dick, this is positively the most assinine turn of events. I am stunned at National's action. I realize their concern, but their concern needs to lie with Wayne Reiner not Tony. Wayne did more harm to those Scouts than Tony's indiscretion ever could. I urge you to reconsider this suspension.

Please feel free to call me to discuss this further. I would also ask that I be present at Tony's fair hearing to back him personally.

Dear Dick:

Just recently it has been brought to my attention that two Scout leaders in the Indian Run District have been relieved of their respective Scout positions.

These two leaders are Mr. Tony Mione and Mr. Steve Kiehl of Pack 85 and Troop 115 in Tower City. It is my understanding that the notice of their termination came from the National Boy Scout office through our Council office.

Dick, consider this a letter of protest to the above mentioned termination of Mr. Mione and Mr. Kiehl.

First of all, let me say that I know Tony Mione longer than I know Steve Kiehl. My association with Tony was while I was Indian Run District Commissioner and he was Scoutmaster of Troop 115. Tony had a fine Troop then, he had some good Scout assistants and he had a good program. Tony got away from Scouting because of work commitments and some personal problems.

After Tony left Scouting was the beginning of problems for Troop 115.

When Tony came back as Scoutmaster of Troop 115 the Troop began to have new life.

As for Steve Kiehl I can tell you I can recall there was a good program in with good leaders. The Pack committee and some leaders resigned and they had a rough time recruiting a Cubmaster and other leaders. Steve Kiehl volunteered to be Cubmaster and told everyone associated with the Pack that he was not the type of person to stand before a large group of people and speak, but he was for the Scouting program and for the kids and with their help the Pack would and could succeed.

I will say that for roughly one year Pack 85 had some problems but they did prevail and I will say that it was because of Steve and his wife.

Recently, I was the Master of Ceremonies for an Eagle Scout presentation in Troop 115. One of the first parts of the ceremony was remarks of the Scoutmaster. Tony Mione when he made his remarks broke down and tried to hold back the tears. Tears not only for the boy but for happiness because something very good happened during a time of petty ante jealousy.

In March or April of this year I was invited to the annual Blue and Gold Banquet for Pack 85. There was a fantastic program, one of the best programs I have seen in a long time. Steve Kiehl and his committee did a bang-up job. A certain portion of the program centered around an Arrow of Light presentation. While

making the Award, Steve Kiehl broke down and cried. His tears for the same reason as Tony.

Dick, I am writing you these examples because these men are Scouters. I have seen them in action, I have talked to them and listened to them when some people in the Indian Run District did not and did not bother with them. These men should be allowed to continue. They should not be kicked out of Scouting. If these men get out of Scouting the program in the Tower City area will take a gigantic step backward.

In closing I do know that is going on in the Tower City area, I know a great deal more than some people think I do. Our District Executive called me one night and told me to keep clear of the Tower City problem. I work with people from the Tower City area, these people talk to me about the problems in Tower City and would like to know what is going on. At one time I was the only resource person Karen Bair had because she wasn't getting any information whatever on the Tower City problem.

Council has a very bad name in Tower City. Council had it before and they have it now. And the way it looks, they'll have it for a very long time. If it were not for Mike Nye and Karen Bair the Scouters in Tower City would run the District and Council out of town.

Thank you for reading this letter and I hope I can share some information with you on this situation.



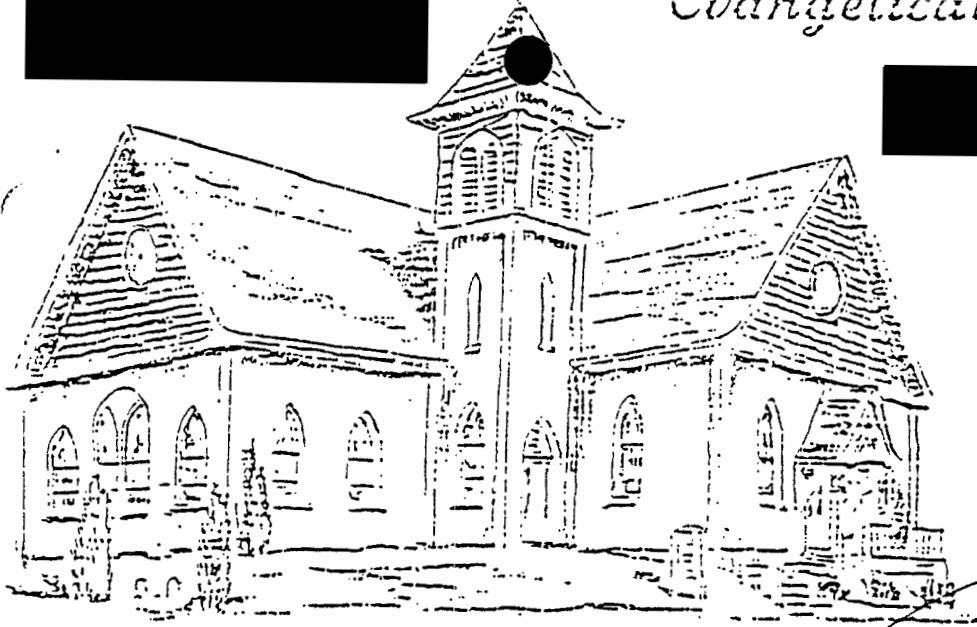

I have enclosed a copy of a letter that I received recently. It was postmarked in Harrisburg, and as you can see it was unsigned. Normally I don't respond in any way to these kinds of letters. But because it involves scouting I am asking an exception.

The writer made a mistake in sending it to me, as the individual involved in the criminal record is the Scoutmaster of Troop #113 in Tower City.

Troop #113 is sponsored by Christ Methodist Church, also of Tower City. When contacted about the facts contained in the letter, Rev. Minnich, Pastor of the church said that "they knew about it, and it was no problem".

I beg to differ with him, and I hope that you do too. Scouting should have high ideals. I know it did when I became an Eagle Scout in 1959. A man such as Mr. Mione would never have been allowed near the kids.

As the head of a sponsoring institution in the Hawk Mountain Council, I respectfully request a full investigation into this matter. I would expect that Mr. Mione would have his registration "suspended" until the investigation is completed, and further, that should the charges prove true, he, be expelled from scouting.

I know that this is a serious matter, and that it will receive your best efforts to resolve the situation.
