On your recent Transmittal No. 48 you included an Additional Enrollment for Troop 66 on which you listed Arthur F. Clark as a Committeeman and Hunter M. Bugg as Scoutmaster. Unfortunately, there are two problems in connection with this that prevent our accepting their infilications.

First of all, you placed arthur F. Clark with us in a confidential capacity late in September of this year. As a result of your earlier report to us, he has already been deleted as positionation; and we are unable to accept his registration in any other capacity.

The second problem is that when Bugg was registered in March of 1965, on the reregistration papers he was listed as being only 19 years of age. WILLIAM COVINGTON: SCOUTMAGTER

The above stated that he knew John Doc from seeing him around the neighborhood in the city, and remembered that they attended school togeather years ago. The second day in camp I invited him to my campsite, after making him aware that liknew him from school and the old neighborhood. I suggested that he some down and give the boys a pre view of scouting and pep talk, and in reference to serit Backer. He did not come to my site until Tuesday night about 9:50 P.M. (Fin referring to site 5) Upon his arrival he came to my leanto, at which time I was distributing cake to my scouts. I think that is when he saw one of the scouts involved. He sat and talked with me for about five or ten minutes, then he proceeded to go from that to tent talking to different scouts, which I throught nothing of. I then lett my leanto and proceeded to go from tent to tent collecting flashlights. I did this because the night before the boys did not go to sleep on time because they shined the lights up and down the area. I passed a tent in which he was (John Doc) sitting talking to two scouts, I didn't take their flashlight because of the fact he was there holding conversation. I then beturned to my leanto and held a Green Bar Meeting. At which time, the close of my Green Bar meeting, I looked out and saw that all lights were out. To my knowledge I did not know when or what time he left my site. Then about 11:15 or 11:30 P.M. The two involved scouts awaken men and told me that the Camp Counselor, who visited them had done something they throught was out of place. I proceeded to question them as to what went on; it was then the totald me that find Doe had taken his hand and proceeded to put it inside one scauts pants. This was repeated several times and in one instance he took the boy's hand and placed it upon his lower part of his privates. The scout stated he with drew his hand only to have taken and placed there again. John Doe then told the other scout to turn off his flashlight and after several minutes of repeat preformance of the above mention incident, the scout then mention that he was sleepy and wish to go be bed. It was then and only then that John Doe, decided to make his exit. To my knowledge I did not know what time he departed my campsite. I was hesistant to repart this matter, because I did not want to involved John Doe, until I was sure that the incident had taken place. I questioned them three or four times seperately and togeather and their story did not change from the first one that was told. I observed the secut who was directly involved doing the day and he refused breakfast and did not want to leave the campsite. I spoke to him again about the ingident and I saw that he was so emotionally upset that I throught it was better that I mort it to someone. I spoke to several other leaders about how I should handle this, do to the fact that if was my first time at Hart with a Troop.

We did interview the scouts involved, and obtained basicip the same facts that was related by the scoutmaster. The scouts also told us that before the lights were turned or order turned out by John Doe, he was pulling on the routh and laying his head against his body. When the youth moved he was roulded back to the cot again both boys tell this story. When the second scout continue to water with his light on he was told to turn his light out which he did and he heard covements and could just see the pulling in the dark. Camping Director has all of the other facts.
