Jury says local man guilty of child sex

WILKES-BARRE — A Newport Township man was convicted Friday in Luzerne County Court of sexually assaulting the 10-year-old daughter of his girlfriend.



Edward Bath

A jury found Edward Bath, 32, of Rock Street in the Glen Lyon section, guilty of two counts of indecent indecent assault and one count of corruption of

minors.

The jury acquitted him of indecent exposure and two counts of aggravated indecent assault.

Bath was charged with assaulting the girl in her mother's home in Glen Lyon in March.

It is the Times Leader's policy not to publish the names of victims of alleged sexual assault.

Both the victim and Bath testified at the trial held before Senior Judge Bernard Podcasy.

The judge ordered Bath returned to Luzerne County Correctional Facility where he has been held for lack of \$25,000 bail since his arrest in March.

The judge told Bath that he has 10 days to file a petition for a new trial.

Assistant district attorney Jim Phillips prosecuted the case. Assistant public defender John Sobota represented Bath.

After careful review, we have decided that your registration with the Boy Scouts of America should be denied. We are therefore compelled to request that you sever any relations that you may have with the Boy Scouts of America. A refund of your registration fee is enclosed.

You should understand that BSA membership registration is a privilege and is not automatically granted to everyone who applies. We reserve the right to refuse registration whenever there is concern that an individual may not meet the high standards of membership which the BSA seeks.

If you wish to have this decision reviewed by a BSA regional review committee, please write to the regional director within 60 days of the date of this letter, explaining your version of the facts supporting your claim that your registration as a BSA member should be granted. The procedures for a review of this decision are attached.

The following information is provided should you desire a review by the Northeast Region, BSA, of the decision to deny your registration.

1. Within 60 days, you must request in writing a review of this decision. Your request should be sent to the regional director, Northeast Region, BSA. In your request you may include your version of what occurred in support of your claim that your registration should not have been denied.
2. Upon receipt of your written request, a committee will be appointed to review the situation.
3. You may attend the review hearing, but it is not adversarial in nature and neither the committee nor you will be represented by legal counsel. If you wish, you may be accompanied by no more than two other individuals if their testimony might assist the committee in discovering the truth and arriving at a correct decision.
4. The committee will review the facts as presented, and may interview any persons whose testimony might assist them in arriving at a correct decision.
5. You will receive a letter setting forth the decision of the committee.
6. If you disagree with the decision of the committee, you may request a review of this decision by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America.

Glen Lyon man is charged with sexual assault of girl, 10

NEWPORT TWP. — A Glen Lyon man accused of sexually assaulting a 10-year-old girl eluded police, tracking dogs and a helicopter in a wooded area of the township for four hours Sunday

but was later arrested in Fairmount Township, police said.

Edward George Bath, 32, was awaiting arraignment late Sunday night before District Justice Joseph Keating in

Pittston on charges of attempted statutory rape, aggravated indecent assault, and indecent assault.

Bath assaulted the girl in her township home late Friday night and early Saturday morning, police said.

Bath was also facing charges of aggravated assault, simple assault and reckless endangerment for an incident at the same home involving a 9-year-old girl, according to township Ptl. Donald Whittaker.

He said the incident was not connected to two rapes and one attempted rape in the township since June 1988.

Whittaker said the alleged victim's mother called police at 12:20 a.m. Saturday to report the incident.

She was advised to take her daughter to the hospital. The youngster was treated and released from Wilkes-Barre General Hospital early Saturday morning.

The Times Leader does not publish the names of alleged sexual assault victims.

Bath was spotted Sunday morning as he parked his car about two blocks away from the home where the assault occurred, police said.

"We spotted him at 10 a.m.," Whittaker said. "After he spotted the cruiser, he ran into a heavily dense wooded area."

Bath's car was impounded, and the manhunt began.

A state police helicopter from the Hazleton barracks and the Wilkes-Barre Police Department's canine unit joined in the search.

Nanticoke police and about 30 volunteers from the community also helped in the unsuccessful search, which was called off about 2 p.m., Whittaker said.

It was not until 5:55 p.m. that Bath was finally located in a Fairmount Township home and taken into custody, police said.
