STATEMENT BY

May 1, 1979 - (approximately) Frank Giammarino asked me for advice. He stated that had informed him that Allen Murphy from the Butler, Pa., staff had asked him if Giammarino was a homosexual. Giammarino stated that he could think of no reason why Murphy would have that idea. I advised Giammarino to confront Allen Murphy with the situation and try to discourage Murphy of talking like that.

This event seems to be unrelated to the following sequence.

Monday

May 7, 1979 - 11:45 p.m. Ron Moranville called me at home to inform me that Scoutmaster David Koltash had just talked with him on the phone and had
told him that one of his Scouts (who later was identified as
had been the victim of a sexual advance by Frank Giammarino.
The incident occurred on Saturday, May 5, 1979, at Camp Anawanna.

Tuesday
May 8, 1979 -

- 10:00 a.m. I phoned Dave Koltash. I was unable to reach him, but I made an appointment for the next morning at 10:00 p.m.

11:00 a.m. I phoned Ed Woodlock at Salem College to inquire about Giammarino's background. Ed Woodlock said that, as he recalled, Giammarino had been accused of a homosexual encounter with a junior camp staff member in 1972 at the Allegheny Highlands Council_Camp. He was exonerated of this charge. Woodlock also told me that he had heard "rumors" from students that Giammarino was a homosexual. He had tried to track these down and, being unable to uncover a factual basis for the rumors, he dismissed them as false.

May 9, 1979 - 1:30 a.m. Ron Moranville received a call from who expressed grave concern over the situation. Moranville told that I was to be in Monessen at 10:00 a.m. to meet with Koltash.

10:00 a.m. I met with Dave Koltash to discuss the situation. Koltash repeated the conversations that had occurred between him The substance of his statements were the same as had been repeated to me by Moranville. Koltash said that, in his opinion, was stable, sincere, and was telling the truth. 11:00 a.m. Koltash and I met with and admonished to tell the truth to me and he office. offered to leave the room if it would make it easier for asked his father to remain. His father stated that he had not corss-examined and that this would be the first time

that he would be hearing about the incident from

stated that on Saturday, May 5, while at Camp Anawanna for an O.A. weekend, Giammarino asked to accompany him on a walking inspection tour of the campsites. This lasted from about 9:30 a.m. until about 11:45 a.m. stated that while on the Hickory campsite near the latrine, Giammarino, without forewarning, put his arms around and his hands on his buttocks. pushed him away. Giammarino retreated from him. Upon my questioning, stated that he could distinguish between horseplay and an embrace. He said that it was definitely not horseplay, but "something different."

They continued walking toward the Delaware campsite when the following questions were asked by Giammarino to

"Have you ever had your cock rubbed?"

"I am going to ask you a question that will make you feel guilty. Do you beat off?"

stated that he did not answer either of these questions, but instead, changed the subject.

When they were on the Delaware campsite, stated that twice Giammarino came toward him and put his hand on crouch.

I asked to show me precisely where Giammarino had touched him.

demonstrated by putting his hand on his crouch.

stated that he was afraid and very shocked at Giammarino's acts. He said that at no time did he encourage Giammarino to continue his advances.

The next day, on Sunday, called his Scoutmaster, Mr. Koltash to tell him about the incident. Because of Koltash's schedule, they did not talk until Monday night. That is when Koltash called Moranville.

I then returned to Pittsburgh and recounted the interviews with Moranville.

2:00 p.m. Moranville and I talked with Giammarino. Giammarino said that he had been with on the walking tour of the camp. He did not admit to the charges as stated by Giammarino went on to say that he would resign from the Boy Scouts of America rather than try and counter the charges of He expressed his concern about publicity in the matter.

2:45 p.m. Moranville told McCook Miller of what had transpired.

3:00 p.m. I placed a call to and finally talked to him at 4:00 p.m. I told him of our conversation with Giammarino and I read to him Giammarino's resignation letter. I asked if there was anything else he wanted us to do. He stated that he was satisfied that we had done everything we could. He was complimentary

of me personally and said that he was particularly pleased with my professionalism in the interview, my appearance and demeanor, and my sensitivity to

4:45 p.m. I informed Dave Koltash of Giammarino's resignation.
Koltash was complimentary of our swift action.

May 10, 1979 I placed a call to our insurance agent, Joe Tice, and on May II was able to talk to him and inform him of the incident.
