

In my case, Mr. Piper said that II was to be in the same room with him, where were no others in the room. Mr Diper said that his steeping bag was wet, and he could'nt go to bed bet, so heaid that he could sleep with me fac a bile, till lis bog dried, as mine was dry. He got into wit擺記e, and soon started playing with my privates. Free tilike screaming, but didnt know what to do orwhat he mide do to me if I objected, but I finally told him he better get into his own bed , which he did. really scared me as I had never been treated this way herore by anyone, and I had liked him and respected him before. I avoided him as much as possible after that, and returned home with no further incident.
